H-2A Program Overview

What Is The H-2A Program?

Authorized under the <u>U.S. Immigration and</u>
 <u>Nationality Act</u> (INA)

The H-2A Temporary Labor Certification Program:

- Agricultural employers
- Shortage of domestic workers
- Initially <u>recruiting local/domestic workers</u>
- Non-immigrant foreign workers, if necessary
- To perform agricultural labor or services
- Temporary or seasonal

Who Can Participate?

- 1. U.S. employer
- 2. With full-time work
- 3. Performed on temporary or seasonal basis

General Eligibility Guidelines

- Located in the United States
- Have an FEIN
- Supervise the workers you employ
- ☐ The work must be full-time
- ☐ Work must be agricultural labor, or services
- Work must be seasonal or temporary in nature

The H-2A Temporary Labor Certification Process Overview

- ☐ Step 1: File H-2A App. with the Chicago National Processing Ctr.
- ☐ Step 2: Create an employer account on Maine JobLink
- ☐ Step 3: Activate your Maine JobLink account
- Step 4: Conduct recruitment for U.S. workers
- ☐ Step 5: Complete pre-occupancy housing inspection
- ☐ Step 6: Complete the Temporary Labor Certification process

Step 1: File Your H-2A Application With The NPC

<u>What</u>: Submit application online with the U.S. DOL to their Office of Foreign Labor Certification's Nation Processing Center (NPC)

When: No less than 45 days before the start date of work

How: Create your employer account and submit application at: https://flag.dol.gov/

Step 2: Create Your Employer Account on MJL

What:

- 1.) Go to the Maine JobLink (MJL) website
- 2.) Create your employer account

When: Concurrently with your account on the FLAG website.

How: Create your MJL employer account at:

https://joblink.maine.gov/

Step 3: Activate Your Employer Account on Maine JobLink

What: Contact the MJL team directly.

When: After your MJL account has been created.

How: Please call us at 207-623-7967, or

Step 4: Conduct Recruitment For U.S. Workers

What: Your independent search for U.S. workers

When: From NOA receipt date, until completion of all recruitment steps

How: See the <u>U.S. DOL Employer Guide to Participation in</u> the H-2A Temporary Agricultural Program (pp. 8-11)

Step 5: Pre-Occupancy Housing Inspection

What: Onsite, checklist-driven inspection of housing facilities provided to H-2A workers

- Prior to April 3, 1980: Employment and Training Administration (ETA) Code of Federal Regulations
- ☐ After April 3, 1980: Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards

When: After NOA receipt date and 32 calendar days prior to the work start date

<u>How</u>: Email <u>Maine.H2A-H2B@maine.gov</u> to schedule your Inspection.

Step 6: Complete Temporary Labor Certification Process

What: Submit additional documents to Chicago National Processing Center:

- 1.) Recruitment Report
- 2.) SWA Housing Certification
- 3.) Workers' Compensation Coverage

When: No less than 30 calendar days before the start date of work
